



hinesburg area recreation trails

hinesburg town forest trails

Description:

Several miles of foot, bike, horse and ATV trails located a few miles southeast of Hinesburg village center. Thanks to the efforts of the Hinesburg Scout Troop several years ago and extensive work by the mountain-biking group, Fellowship of the Wheels, these forest trails offer something for almost everyone s for hiking, skiing, snowshoeing or horseback. An intricate network of trails offers the mountain-biker different levels of difficulty from beginner to advanced. Those trails are also perfect for foot traffic of walking, hiking, skiing or snowshoeing. The forest also offers a long circuitous loop for hikers, horseback riding and ATV use.



Driving Directions to Hinesburg Town Forest (West Entrance):

From Hinesburg Town Hall:

- South on Route 116 for 2.2 miles;
- Turn left onto North Road;
- Follow North Road for 1 mile to Hayden Hill Road West;
- Turn right onto Hayden Hill Road West;
- Follow Hayden Hill Road West for 1.5 miles;
- The parking area for the Hinesburg Town Forest is on the right.

Driving Directions to Hinesburg Town Forest (East Entrance):

From Hinesburg Town Hall:

- South on Route 116 for 2.2 miles;
- Turn left onto North Road;
- Follow North Road for 2.2 miles to Texas Hill Road;
- Turn right onto Texas Hill Road;
- Follow Texas Hill Road for 2.75 miles;
- Turn right onto Hayden Hill Road East;
- Follow Hayden Hill Road East for .3 miles;
- The parking area for the Hinesburg Town Forest is on the left.

Driving Directions to Hinesburg Town Forest (Southwest Entrance):

From Hinesburg Town Hall:

- South on Route 116 for 2.2 miles;
- Turn left onto North Road;
- Follow North Road for 2.2 miles to Texas Hill Road;
- Turn right onto Texas Hill Road;
- Follow Texas Hill Road for approximately 3.2 miles;
- Bear Right onto Texas Hill Circle
- A short distance later turn right onto Economou Road
- Follow Economou Road until it ends
- The parking area for the Hinesburg Town Forest is located at the end of Economou Road

Trailhead: Information boards are located at all three trailheads.

Notes: Note any information updates at the information boards and use only the trails that are appropriate for your form of recreation – Foot, Bike, Horse or ATV.
